#### LICENCE COMMISSIONER'S COMMENTS

A new application for a Hospitality Food Service – Lunch Counter licence at 572 Mill Street, Windsor, ON N9C 2R8 was submitted on September 28, 2017 by Ms. Rabbia Pandit on behalf of 1965466 Ontario Inc. o/a Wings Convenience Store. Licensing records indicate that this applicant has never been licensed by the City of Windsor however, records do indicate that Wings Convenience has operated as a Food Store at this location under several owners since at least 1997. The first appearance of a Hospitality Food Service – Lunch Counter licence was in 2003.

#### REGULATORY AUTHORITY

**Business Licensing By-Law 395-2004** 

#### 3.8 Licence - application - subject to approval

Every application will be subject to investigations approvals from such municipal or provincial departments or agencies as the Licence Commissioner deems necessary, or as directed by the Windsor Licensing Commission, including but not limited to: Police Services, Windsor/Essex County Health Unit, Fire and Rescue Services Department, Building and Development Department, Environmental Services Department and Licensing and Enforcement Department.

# 3.25 Licensing powers - Licence Commissioner - issue or renew

Upon receipt of an application in the prescribed form for a licence or renewal thereof, shall make or cause to be made all investigation required by law and if the investigation disclose any reason to believe that the applicant is not of good character or that the carrying on of the said trade, calling, business or occupation will be likely to result in a breach of the law or be in any way adverse to the public interest, the Licence Commissioner shall recommend to the Windsor Licensing Commission that it not issue or renew the licence or that it impose conditions on the issuance of a licence, otherwise, the Licence Commissioner shall recommend to the Windsor Licensing Commission that it issue or renew the licence.

# 3.31 Refusal - suspension - revocation - by Windsor Licensing Commission - hearing

(1) At the hearing, the Windsor Licensing Commission may suspend, revoke or refuse to issue any licence under this by-law:

(a) for any reason that would disentitle the holder to a licence if he/she were an

applicant;(b) where the holder of the licence or applicant is in breach of a condition of the licence or of this by-law;

(c) if there are reasonable grounds to believe that the statements on the licence application are false;

(d) if a report is filed subsequent to the date of the issuance of the licence by any department or agency which provided its approval originally to the issuance of the licence which indicates that a licensed premises no longer complies with any of the provisions of this by-law;

(e) upon such grounds as are set out in this by-law;

(f) if the applicant has outstanding fines or penalties owing to the municipality or has not paid the required licence application fee;

(g) if the conduct or character of the applicant or licensee affords reasonable cause to believe that the applicant or licensee will not carry on or engage in the business in accordance with the law or with honesty and integrity;

(h) if the geographic location of the business does not meet land use requirements;

(i) if, in the case of a corporate applicant or licensee, the conduct of its officers, directors, employees or agents affords reasonable cause to believe that the business will not be engaged in or carried on in accordance with the law or with honesty and integrity; or

(j) if issuing a licence is not in the public interest.

## BACKGROUND

- January 27, 2017, Ms. Rabbia Pandit makes application on behalf of 1965466 Ontario Inc. o/a Wings Convenience Store for a Hospitality Food Service – Lunch Counter licence.
- April 13, 2017, Ken Passa, Supervisor of Environmental Quality enters the following note into the AMANDA system: "Grease trap cleaned out 3 weeks ago due to a blockage in the sink. Unable to open the trap (piping required to be removed) next cleaning in two months. Advised owner to call us when trap is removed for inspection."
- September 20, 2017, the Supervisor of Environmental Quality adds: "The grease trap is still under the sink and cannot be properly inspected. They state that a plumber has been in to pressure wash the pipes due to blockages. This is obviously due to the grease trap not being maintained/cleaned." A denial is issued.

- September 20, 2017, a letter is sent by Licensing to Ms. Pandit's attention advising
  that the department has been notified by the Public Works Department that an
  approval was not granted following their inspections. A request was made that he
  contacts the Supervisor of Environmental Quality by October 9, 2017 to address the
  issues found in previous inspections.
- October 11, 2017, an email is sent by the Licensing Department to the Supervisor requesting an update as to the status of this business. The Supervisor's response indicated "I have heard nothing from them."

#### **SUMMARY**

Administration recommends to the Windsor Licensing Commission that it refuse to issue a Hospitality Food Service — Lunch Counter licence to the applicant at 572 Mill Street, Windsor, ON N9C 2R8. It is not in the public interest to issue a licence since they have outstanding issues with the Public Works Department that they have failed to correct. Should the Windsor Licensing Commission decide to refuse to issue the licence, the applicant would be required to correct outstanding deficiencies identified by the Public Works Department, re-apply for their licence and pay the applicable fees.

# RECOMMENDATION:

**THAT** the Windsor Licensing Commission **REFUSE TO ISSUE** Hospitality Food Service – Lunch Counter application #17 108319, submitted by Ms. Rabbia Pandit on behalf of 1965466 Ontario Inc. o/a Wings Convenience Store at 572 Mill Street, Windsor, ON N9C 2R8.

#### LICENCE COMMISSIONER'S COMMENTS

Applications for an Automobile Service Station – Repairs licence #17 178777 and Automobile Service Station – Storage & Sales licence #17 178781 was submitted by Mohsen Farahat on behalf of 2207113 Ontario Inc. O/A Downtown Auto Center on October 5, 2017. AMANDA records indicate that Mr. Farahat has held similar licences since 2010 at 663 Glengarry before moving to 939 Giles Blvd W in June of 2016. Since the licensee moved to 939 Giles Blvd E in June of 2016 several complaints have been received with regards to condition of the property/alley which have been addressed by the By-Law Enforcement Unit.

#### "SCHEDULE A3 TO BY-LAW NO. 395-2004

#### **AUTOMOBILE SERVICE STATIONS**

- No licensee shall store or park or allow to be stored or parked thereat, any trailer used for human habitation while so stored or parked.
- No licensee shall use or permit their premises to be used, for the purpose of wrecking or storing motor vehicles that are no longer operable, except in an enclosed building for vulcanizing tires or tubes.
- 3. No licensee shall permit the engine of a motor vehicle to run while in any building, whether on a frame or in a motor vehicle, unless adequate ventilation is provided to ensure dilution of any carbon monoxide fumes.

- 4. No licence shall be issued to an applicant for a automobile service station unless and until the Licence Commissioner has been furnished with satisfactory proof that:
  - (1) where applicable, Technical Standards and Safety Authority has reported in writing that the premises comply with the provisions of the Technical Standards and Safety Act, 2000 for the handling of liquid fuels and propane.
  - (2) The Fire Chief has reported in writing that the premise complies with the Ontario Fire Code.
- 5. Every owner or operator shall erect, maintain and repair at their own expense, screening fences to visually separate areas and to block off views of storage areas, and to provide that the screening fence be continuous except at driveway entrances or where lines of sight are required for traffic safety purposes.
- 6. No licensee shall use or permit to be used as a waiting lane any area or any public right-of-way which would hinder the flow of traffic on the public highway.
- 7. Every owner or operator must keep the service station and any sidewalk or street upon which the premises abut, in a clean and neat condition, free from debris, snow, ice, dirt, rubbish or other foreign substances derived from the licensed premises or resulting from the use of the licensed premises.
- 8. Every owner or operator must keep and maintain all washroom facilities in a clean and sanitary condition.
- 9. Every owner or operator must park all motor vehicles on the licensed premises and in a neat and orderly manner.
- 10. Every owner or operator must ensure that lighting fixtures used are of a type and are arranged so that they do not cause nuisance or distraction to passing traffic or adjoining properties."

#### BACKGROUND

On August 18, 2017 a proactive inspection was completed by By-Law Enforcement Officer Daryl Flacks. The following violations were observed under Schedule A3 of Business Licensing By-Law 395-2004:

- No licensee shall use or permit their premises to be used, for the purpose of wrecking or storing motor vehicles that are no longer operable, except in an enclosed building for vulcanizing tires or tubes.
- 2. Every owner or operator shall erect, maintain and repair at their own expense, screening fences to visually separate areas and to block off views of storage areas, and to provide that the screening fence be continuous except at driveway entrances or where lines of sight are required for traffic safety purposes.
- 3. No licensee shall use or permit to be used as a waiting lane any area or any public right-of-way which would hinder the flow of traffic on the public highway.
- 4. Every owner or operator must keep the service station and any sidewalk or street upon which the premises abut, in a clean and neat condition, free from debris, snow, ice, dirt, rubbish or other foreign substances derived from the licensed premises or resulting from the use of the licensed premises.

5. Every owner or operator must park all motor vehicles on the licensed premises and in a neat and orderly manner.

Officer Flacks took several pictures with his City issued cell phone of the site conditions (attached as Appendix "B"). A letter was prepared by Officer Flacks and hand delivered to the licensee Moshen Farahat. Mr. Farahat was educated on Schedule A3 of By-Law 395-2004 including an explanation of the letter's contents (attached as Appendix "C").

On September 12, 2017 Officer Flacks returned for a follow up inspection. The violations as reported during the initial inspection on August 18, 2017 still remained. Photos were taken by Officer Flacks representing the conditions seen at time of inspection (attached as Appendix "D").

On September 13, 2017 Officer Flacks hand delivered a follow up letter to licensee Moshen Farahat giving him till October 9, 2017 to bring his licensed premises into compliance with Schedule A3 of By-Law 395-2004 (attached as Appendix "E").

On October 11, 2017 Officer Flacks returned to the property to find the premise in the same condition as the previous two inspections. Photos were taken by Officer Flacks representing the conditions seen at the time of inspection (attached as Appendix "F").

#### **SUMMARY**

The By-law Enforcement office has identified that the licensee is not operating within the guidelines under Schedule A3 of Business Licensing By-Law 395-2004. The By-law Enforcement office has issued two (2) separate deficiency letters and has provided detailed instructions to bring the business operation into compliance. The licensee has done very little to improve the conditions. It is in the interest of public safety to suspend the licences associated with Mr. Farahat's business until the premise is brought into compliance as requested by the By-law Enforcement office.

## RECOMMENDATION:

That Automobile Service Station – Repairs licence #17 178777 & Automobile Service Station – Storage/Sales licence #17 178781, issued to 2207113 Ontario Inc. O/A Downtown Auto Center, **BE SUSPENDED** until the licensee operates in compliance with Business Licensing By-law 395-2004 to the satisfaction of the By-law Enforcement office.

And further that,

Automobile Service Station – Repairs licence #17 178777 & Automobile Service Station – Storage/Sales licence # 17 178781, issued to 2207113 Ontario Inc. O/A Downtown Auto Center, **BE REVOKED** should the licensee fail to comply within thirty (30) days from the date of this decision.

Re: Licensing By-law 395-2004- A3 – Automobile Service Station

This letter is further to my visit to your location on 18, August 2017 following a complaint received by the Enforcement Unit regarding the condition of the licensed property. Upon inspection it was noted that there are dilapidated cars, tires, car doors, engines, refuse, and garbage/debris all over the premises.

By-Law Number 395-2004 is the licensing by-law for the City of Windsor. Schedule A3 speaks to automobile service stations. The following are violations under that law for which you are in violation;

- 1. No licensee shall use or permit their premises to be used, for the purpose of wrecking or storing motor vehicles that are no longer operable, except in an enclosed building for vulcanizing tires or tubes.
- 2. Every owner or operator shall erect, maintain and repair at their own expense, screening fences to visually separate areas and to block off views of storage areas, and to provide that the screening fence be continuous except at driveway entrances or where lines of sight are required for traffic safety purposes.
- 3. No licensee shall use or permit to be used as a waiting lane any area or any public right-of-way which would hinder the flow of traffic on the public highway.
- 4. #### FINAL NOTICE

Re: Licensing By-law 395-2004- A3 - Automobile Service Station

This letter is further to my visit to your location on 12, September 2017 following a complaint received by the Enforcement Unit regarding the condition of the licensed property. Upon reinspection it was noted that there remain dilapidated cars, tires, car doors, engines, refuse, and garbage/debris all over the premises.

By-Law Number 395-2004 is the licensing by-law for the City of Windsor. Schedule A3 speaks to automobile service stations. The following are violations under that law for which you are in violation;

1. No licensee shall use or permit their premises to be used, for the purpose of wrecking or storing motor vehicles that are no longer operable, except in an enclosed building for vulcanizing tires or tubes.

Every owner or operator shall erect, maintain and repair at their own expense, screening
fences to visually separate areas and to block off views of storage areas, and to provide
that the screening fence be continuous except at driveway entrances or where lines of
sight are required for traffic safety purposes.

3. No licensee shall use or permit to be used as a waiting lane any area or any public right-of-way which would hinder the flow of traffic on the public highway.

4. Every owner or operator must keep the service station and any sidewalk or street upon which the premises abut, in a clean and neat condition, free from debris, snow, ice, dirt, rubbish or other foreign substances derived from the licensed premises or resulting from the use of the licensed premises.

5. Every owner or operator must park all motor vehicles on the licensed premises and in a neat and orderly manner.
