7. **APPLICATIONS/HEARINGS**

(a) **Samuel Terrence McKay (Guardian of "Zeus") – Dangerous Dog**

Terry McKay and Carol McKay are present and available to answer questions. Terry McKay provides the following comments as it relates to "Zeus" and the incident that occurred:

- Carol McKay took the dog for a walk. The dog had a gentle leader dog leash which restricted the dog's mouth to open beyond the size of a golf ball.
- This incident was a freak accident. The dog has no problem with other animals
- He indicates he advised the "victim" to take her dog to the veterinarian and he would pay the bill.

Mr. McKay provides letters of support and several photographs of "Zeus", **attached** as Appendix "A".

Leslie Powlenzuk, victim is present and provides the following comments relating to the incident that occurred:

- The dog "Zeus" did not have a mouth guard. The dog broke free from Carol McKay, she fell down at which time Zeus attacked her dog.
- Zeus came out of nowhere and held her dog "Tippy" in its mouth shaking her dog like a rag doll.
- Zeus weighs approximately 160 lbs and Tippy weighs 19 pounds.
- Tippy's entire back was ripped open by Zeus. Surgery was required.
- Zeus did not have a muzzle and children were playing at the park.

- Tippy has been traumatized by the attack and constantly licks her paws and will not go outside alone. Her dog will never be the same again.

Moved by Councillor Dilkens, seconded by Councillor Sleiman,
WLC1/14 That the **DANGEROUS DOG** designation **REMAIN IN PLACE** For 5 year old English Mastiff known as "Zeus" which currently resides with guardian, Terry McKay at 1212 George Avenue in Windsor, Ontario, and further, that the following actions **BE REQUIRED** as a result of this designation:

1. To keep such dog, when in or on the property of another person with the person's consent, on a leash and under the control of that person who is sixteen years of age or more.
2. Conspicuously display on his or her property a sign provided by the city warning that there is a dangerous dog on the property.
3. To securely attach a muzzle to such dog at all times when it is not confined in accordance with section 17 (a).
4. Obtain and maintain a policy liability insurance coverage in an amount of not less than \$1,000,000 for any damage or injury caused by such dangerous dog and to provide to the Animal Control Officer, a Certificate of such policy and each subsequent renewal of it.
5. Insert a microchip implantation in such dog, at the Guardian's expense, for the purpose of identifying such dog as a dangerous dog.
6. To restrain the dangerous dog in accordance with any written directives which may be given by an Animal Control Officer.

(b) Mary Ferrar, Owner – Playhouse – Body Rub Parlour

Mary Ferrar, applicant is not present to speak to the matter.

Jillian Cassandra Rynyk is present and available to answer questions.

M. Chantler advises no one witnessed if “Shadow” and “Maxine” killed the cat residing at 1584 Ellrose.

Jillian Cassandra Rynyk provides the following comments as it relates to the alleged attack on the neighbour’s cat:

- She has raised “smart loving dogs who love cats”
- Her sister left the gate open which allowed the dogs to run loose. This will not happen again.
- She is on a disability pension and cannot afford the liability insurance for her dogs, however, she agrees with the recommendations in the report of the Deputy Licence Commissioner.

Moved by Councillor Dilkens, seconded by Councillor Sleiman,
WLC4/14 That a **DANGEROUS DOG** designation **BE PLACED** on the German Shepherd and German Shepherd/Rotti mix dogs known as Shadow and Maxine, which currently reside with guardian Jillian Cassandra Rynyk, 1584 Ellrose, Windsor, Ontario and further, **THAT** the following actions **BE REQUIRED** as a result of this designation:

- To keep such dog, when in or on the property of another person with the person’s consent, on a leash and under the control of that person who is sixteen years of age or more.
 - To insert a microchip implantation in such dog, at the Guardian’s expense, for the purpose of identifying such dog as a dangerous dog.
 - Given that the incident occurred while the dogs were off leash and not under the owner’s control, and that it would most likely not have happened if they were on leash, we recommend that the usual muzzling requirements **BE LIFTED** in this case,
 - That Administration **BE REQUESTED** to work with guardian Jillian Cassandra Rynyk, to determine an adequate amount of insurance.

LICENCE COMMISSIONER'S COMMENTS

Mr. Mohammad Aslam, Taxicab Plateholder for #147 submitted the attached application to the Licensing Division on January 13, 2014 for the prospective transfer to his son Mr. Mohammad Javed Aslam.

REGULATORY AUTHORITY

Schedule 5, Part VII, Section 20.1 through 20.4 of Licensing By-law 137-2007 states:

"20.1 Except as approved by the Licensing Commission, a taxicab plate holder may not transfer a taxicab plate and associated taxicab plate holder licence for a period of at least five (5) years from the date of issue of the licence.

20.2 No taxicab plate holder licence shall be transferred without the approval of the Licensing Commission.

20.3 No taxicab plate holder licence shall be transferred until the person to whom the transfer is to be made has first received approval from the Licence Commissioner as a licensee.

20.4 Subject to the restrictions herein, taxicab plates numbered 001 to 224 are transferable, provided that:

- (a) the transferee satisfies the eligibility criteria for inclusion on the Drivers' List;
- (b) the transferee signs a form of statutory declaration prescribed by the Licence Commissioner;
- (c) the transferor has completed a written application for the transfer in the prescribed form;
- (d) the transferee satisfies the requirements of a taxicab plate holder under this By-law, including submitting for inspection the taxicab to which the plate will be affixed;
- (e) the transferee pays all fees required under this By-law;

and the transferee will receive a taxicab plate holder licence at the time of transfer of the taxicab plate."

Further, Section 21.3 states:

"A taxicab or taxicab wheelchair accessible vehicle plate holder who has held a licence for a minimum of one (1) year may lease the taxicab or taxicab wheelchair accessible vehicle licence on a daily, weekly, monthly or yearly basis provided that:

- (a) the lessee is licensed by the City of Windsor as a taxicab driver;
- (b) all weekly, monthly or yearly leases are filed with and approved by the Licence Commissioner and shall be subject to such terms and conditions the Licence Commissioner may require;
- (c) the amount charged under the lease shall be a fair fee as approved by the Licence Commissioner and no additional charges shall be made against the lessee;
- (d) the lease agreement shall include a statement that the leasing agreement is considered null and void in the event that the lessor or lessee, either by written or verbal agreement, sub-leases the taxicab or taxicab wheelchair accessible vehicle or transfers responsibility for the operation of the taxicab or taxicab wheelchair accessible vehicle to a third party;
- (e) the lease agreement shall contain a clearly-stated right of the lessor and lessee to early termination of the lease;
- (f) where the lessee is a corporation, the lessee shall, at the time at which the lease is filed with the Licence Commissioner in accordance with the provision of this section, file with the Licence Commissioner a form supplied by the Licence Commissioner and a copy of the lessee's articles of incorporation, amendment or amalgamation; and,
- (g) the lease term shall be a minimum of twelve (12) months and a maximum of twenty-four (24) months."

BACKGROUND

- July 10, 2013, transfer application and fee was received from Mrs. Diana Caverhill, plate holder of #021, being as Appendix "A"
- July 10, 2013, transferee application was submitted, being Appendix "B".

SUMMARY

Mr. Mohammad Aslam has been a taxi plate holder for more than the minimum of 5 years; therefore, compliant with section 20.1. His son, Mr. Mohammad Javed Aslam is not currently a licensed plate holder. Further, Licensing records indicate he has been licensed as a taxicab driver since 2002 and meets the criteria for the drivers wait list.

Administration is prepared to recommend that the transfer be completed pending the following outstanding items:

Mr. Mohammad Javed Aslam must provide:

- (a) Verification of an appropriate vehicle to which he will affix taxicab plate # 147
- (b) A completed Plate Holder application and pay the associated fee

RECOMMENDATION

THAT the transfer of Taxicab Plate #147 from Mr. Mohammad Aslam to Mr. Mohammad Javed Aslam **BE APPROVED** with the following conditions:

- Mr. Mohammad Javed Aslam be given thirty (30) days from the date of this decision to submit a vehicle for inspection that complies with Schedule 5 to By-law 137-2007.
- Mr. Mohammad Javed Aslam must submit a Plate Holder application and pay the applicable fee.
- Mr. Mohammad Javed Aslam shall not lease the plate for a one year period as stated in Schedule 5, Section 21.3 of Licensing By-law 137-2007.

LICENCE COMMISSIONER'S COMMENTS

Dangerous Dog designation appeal was submitted to the Licensing Division on December 31, 2013 by Jean-Luc Woodrich of 1366 Curry, Windsor, guardian of 1, male, black lab/border collie mix dog called, “Shadow”.

REGULATORY AUTHORITY

Dangerous Dog and Mitigating Factors are defined by By-law 245-2004, a By-law for the Registration and Licensing of Dogs and for the Control of Dogs Generally within the City of Windsor as follows:

“Dangerous Dog”:

“means a dog that, in the absence of any mitigating factor has attacked, bitten, or caused injury to a person or has demonstrated a propensity, tendency or disposition to do so;
means

a dog that, in the absence of any mitigating factor, has significantly injured a domestic animal; or means a dog, previously designated as a potentially dangerous dog, that is kept or permitted to be kept by its guardian in violation of the requirements for such dog”

“Mitigating Factors”:

“ means a circumstance which excuses aggressive behaviour of a dog and without limiting the generality of the foregoing, may include circumstances where:

“the dog was, at the time of the aggressive behaviour, acting in defence to an attack from a person or domestic animal;
the dog was, at the time of the aggressive behaviour, acting in defence of its young or reacting to a person or domestic animal trespassing on the property of its guardian; or the dog was, at the time of the aggressive behaviour, being teased, provoked or tormented”

BY-LAW NO. 245-2004

17. If an Animal Control Officer designates a dog as a dangerous dog, the Animal Control

Officer shall serve notice upon the Guardian, requiring the Guardian, upon receipt of such notice to comply with the following requirements:

a) to keep such dog confined;

i. within the guardian's dwelling, or

ii. in an enclosed pen of sufficient dimension and strength to be humane shelter for the dog and to prevent the dog from coming in contact with or making a real and substantial threat of attack on a person other than the guardian of the dog;

iii. conspicuously display on his or her property a sign provided by the City warning that there is a dangerous dog on the property.

b) to securely attach a muzzle to such dog at all times when it is not confined in accordance with section 17(a);

c) to obtain and maintain in force a policy of public liability insurance issued by an insurer licensed by the Province of Ontario providing third party liability coverage in an amount of not less than \$1,000,000.00 for any damage or injury caused by such dangerous dog and to provide to the Animal Control Officer a Certificate of such policy and each subsequent renewal of it. Such policy shall contain a provision requiring the insurer to immediately notify the Animal Control Officer should the policy expire, be cancelled or be terminated for any reason; and

d) to permit the Animal Control Officer to have a veterinarian insert a microchip implantation in such dog, at the Guardian's expense, for the purpose of identifying such dog as a dangerous dog;

e) To restrain the dangerous dog in accordance with any written directives which may be given by an Animal Control Officer.

BACKGROUND

- The Windsor Essex County Humane Society received a Windsor Police report concerning a dog bite incident that took place on November 10, 2013 in the back alley of Curry Street in Windsor, Ontario, Canada. After reading the report and the statements it was determined that no mitigating factors were present and the dog

should be deemed dangerous in accordance with the Windsor By-law 245-2004 as amended.

- A Humane Society Officer attended the address of 1366 Curry and made contact with a female resident that acted as the custodian of Shadow. The dog "Shadow" that lived at the residence was deemed dangerous.
- Afterwards Jean-Luc Woodrich's mother phoned The Humane Society and spoke with the Executive Director, Melanie Coulter. His mother claimed that Jean-Luc was too upset to speak but claimed there are several dogs in his neighborhood that resemble Shadow and he was falsely accused. It was said that his dog was in the backyard the whole time and it did not make sense that Shadow would jump out of the yard and then jump back into the yard.
- On Monday, January 27, 2014 an officer from the Windsor Essex County Humane Society returned to 1366 Curry, Windsor, Ontario, Canada to speak with the owner of Shadow. Jean-Luc Woodrich allowed the officer to take a picture of Shadow. He did wish to state that during the incident on November 10, 2013 his dog was not involved due to the fact that he could see that his dog was in his backyard when the bite took place.
- On January 30, 2014 an officer with the Windsor Essex County Humane Society was able to make contact with Dajun Taylor and arrange a time to meet her and speak to her about the incident that took place on November 10, 2013.
- On February 3, 2014 an Officer with the Windsor Essex County Humane Society was able to speak with Dajun Taylor concerning the bite incident that took place on November 10, 2013. Taylor stated that her dog was attacked by "Shadow" the dog at 1366 Curry on November 10, 2013 and during the incident "Shadow" also grabbed her ankle and started shaking. She stated that she knew it was "Shadow" because she saw it jump the fence back into the yard of 1366 Curry. Taylor also mentioned that it wasn't the first time "Shadow" had jumped the fence and attacked her dog. Taylor also stated she would provide photos of the injury to her ankle and the hospital records associated with the injury.

SUMMARY

The Windsor/Essex County Humane Society investigation led to the conclusion that Shadow attacked Dajun Taylor and her dog Crip without mitigating factors. Therefore, we are recommending that the designation of Dangerous Dog remain in place.

RECOMMENDATION:

That a DANGEROUS DOG designation **REMAIN IN PLACE** on the Border Collie/lab mix dog known as Shadow which currently reside with guardian Jean-Luc Woodrich, 1366 Curry, Windsor, Ontario, and further, **THAT** the following actions **BE REQUIRED** as a result of this designation:

1. To keep such dog, when in or on the property of another person with the person's consent, on a leash and under the control of that person who is sixteen years of age or more.

2. Conspicuously display on his or her property a sign provided by the city warning that there is a dangerous dog on the property.
3. To securely attach a muzzle to such a dog at all times when it is not confined in accordance with section 17(a).
4. To obtain and maintain in force a policy of public liability insurance issued by an insurer licensed by the Province of Ontario providing third party liability coverage in an amount of not less than \$1,000,000.00 for any damage or injury caused by such potentially dangerous dog and to provide to the Animal Control Officer a Certificate of such policy and each subsequent renewal of it

Narrative: On Tuesday November 12, 2013 at 1830 hours Constable DAVIS and myself (Constable PENNER) attended 1400 Pelletier St upper unit regarding an animal bite.

Upon arrival officers spoke to the victim identified as Dajun-Anne TAYLOR, a female black boy [REDACTED] TAYLOR was upstairs and walking with the help of crutch's. Her right ankle was wrapped up in a soft cast.

TAYLOR provided a statement stating that last night at around 2030 hours,

she went to walk her dog Crip. Crip is a male mixed boxer/black lab. TAYLOR walked her normal route which is south in the 1300 block of McKay, then turned down the alley at Curry to walk to the store located at Tecumseh and Curry. TAYLOR was maybe forty feet down the alley when she heard the sound of what she thought was a dog running towards her, she could hear a dog collar jingling.

TAYLOR turned around and observed large dog, a black/lab mix, 60-70Lbs running in her direction. She recognized this dog from the corner house located at 1368 Curry, as this dog had jumped the fence before and tried to attack Crip. The dog then attacked Crip and started fighting. TAYLOR tries to intervene and in the process falls in between the two dogs, she was trying to get them apart by kicking at them. The other dog grabs onto her right ankle and clamped down, shaking its head. TAYLOR advised that the dogs fought for a long time, to the point where they were exhausted. She kept yelling at the dog to get away and trying to scare it away, but it wouldn't leave. The dog was ignoring her until a lady yelled, the dog stopped, then ran back to its backyard.

Due to her injury, TAYLOR was able to limp half way home, then crawl back the rest of the way. She then called her mother who drove her to Hotel Dieu hospital. TAYLOR advised that her right ankle is very sore, she refused to get stitches, however got it treated and wrapped up in a soft cast. She isn't sure at this time if there is any damage to her tendons or ligaments.

Officers advised TAYLOR to attend WPS HQ tomorrow during the day in order for Ident to photograph her injuries.

Officers subsequently attended the residence in question, which turned out to be 1366 Curry Ave, not 1368 Curry as described by TAYLOR. It can be noted that 1368 and 1366 Curry is a duplex. Officers spoke to the resident at 1366 Curry Ave identified as Jean-Luc WOODRICH, a male white, born [REDACTED]. WOODRICH advised that he is the owner of a male black lab/border collie mix, name of 'Shadow'. WOODRICH stated that 'Shadow' does on occasion jump over the backyard fence to fight with other dogs, but has never bitten a person. WOODRICH explained that 'Shadow' has all of his shots.

With the information received I believed that WOODRICH was responsible for taking care of 'Shadow' and in the interest of public safety, was advised to get a leash or chain for 'Shadow', when he lets him out into the backyard.

I personally served WOODRICH with the above mentioned Provincial offences notice for 'Permit dog to bite person without provocation', City of Windsor Bylaw 245-204, section 14. I advised WOODRICH of his options, he stated he understood.

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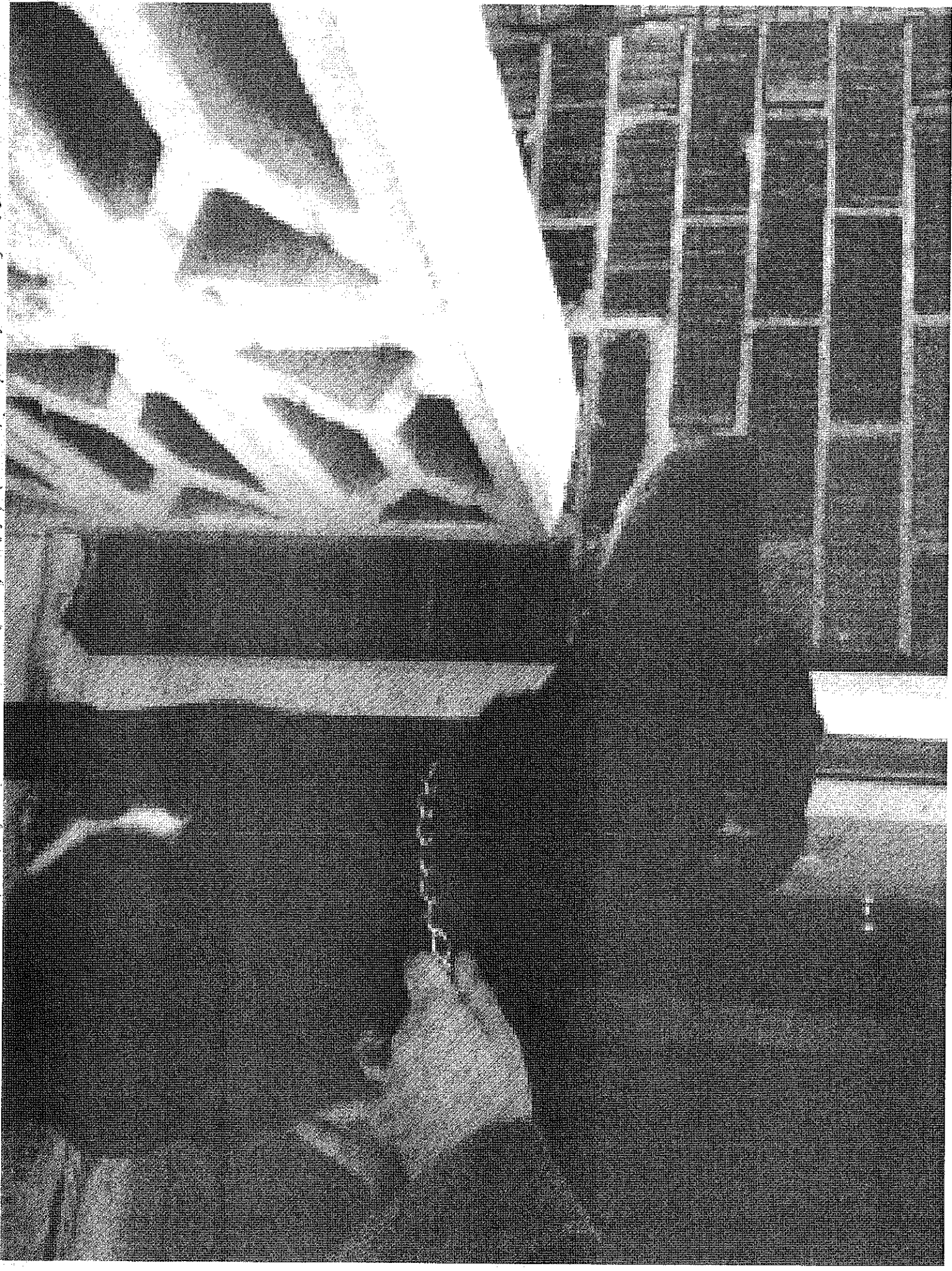
