

**Subject:** UN Day for Elder Persons and Canada Seniors Day Windsor City Hall Square Sept 29

Dear Friends and Supporters:

My thanks to all of you for making our 2017 UN and Canada Senior's Day event the 'best ever'! The weather cooperated after a threatening rain forecast all week.

Our turnout was larger than normal enhanced by the youthful energy of the John Campbell PS Choir and The Diplomats Marching Band. We did for first time attract successfully several groups from local assisted living facilities and retirement homes. Organizers decided on a new style intergenerational program on the theme "Windsor - An Age Friendly Community - A City For All Ages".

In the spirit of community we were delighted that Tom Bain, Essex County Warden brought greetings to the event along with Ed Sleiman, Councillor, representing Windsor's Mayor. As in the past the City issued an event related Proclamation. We will need to continue to work cooperatively with City Council and Administration, and now County Council, to ensure smooth communications and avoid last minute surprises.

Seniors do not naturally attract attention despite their dominant demographic and economic presence as well of course to the huge investment they have and continue to make to their families and communities through their volunteering efforts. We were pleased that CTV News provided coverage but will need to continue to work to attract other media attention.

The heart of our 2017 program was the entertainment provided by The Diplomats and our intergenerational choirs from Campbell School and from Life After Fifty. Special mention must be accorded to the well prepared and heartwarming presentations from our three students, Alyssa Langlois, Campbell PS, Hanna McCullough, The Diplomats, Angelica Lu, University of Windsor and student intern at ASWE. Remarkable young people!

While we opted for fewer speeches we did in 2017 have Nick Stein, PSAC, present on current pension related matters reflecting seniors priority interest in financial security particularly for future generations which complemented our intergenerational theme.

We did continue last year's precedent offering a 'free' hot dog lunch in the adjacent All Saints Church Hall. Many thanks to the volunteers who prepared and served smoothly the food. Special thanks to the ASWE for augmenting our volunteers and for contributing a number of delicious sweets trays.

Similar thanks go to the event financial supporters especially Windsor SAC, CARP Windsor Essex Chapter and the Regional Retirees Council including NPRC, UNIFOR and MROO. Special thanks to Karen Demers, SAC, and Angelica Lu, ASWE student

intern, for providing yeoman organizing support particularly Karen for organizing the entertainment and Angelica for her IT and administrative support.

Our budget this year was about \$1200, split for food, about \$450, and logistics (buses, hall rental, appearance fee) the remainder. This is too tight a budget permitting little flexibility for publicity and promotion and administrative support (though this year the ASWE was particularly generous for the latter).

To the event supporting organizations, our mission to honour and recognize seniors on this UN and Canadian date remains worthy. We can certainly build on the favourable experiences in 2017 to increase participation and more media coverage

In conclusion, let's further promote Windsor's Age Friendly Community leadership by organizing on November 3, at the WFCU Centre, a successful AFC Seniors Summit!

## Province Releases New Action Plan for Seniors

Yesterday, the Ontario government released *Aging with Confidence: Ontario's Action Plan for Seniors*. The plan includes commitments to a range of measures intended to support seniors including enhancing municipal services. Ontario will be investing \$155 million over three years through the action plan. This will include improving long-term care homes, supporting age-friendly communities, and providing additional services to seniors.

It is welcome news to see new government investments in seniors' services and planning initiatives. AMO has advocated for: increased hours of care in long-term care homes; enhancing culturally appropriate practices; engaging in a capacity review to determine the need for more long-term care beds; better transportation options in rural and northern areas; and, expansion of age-friendly programs that support municipal governments to provide services to seniors.

A full set of recommendations can be found in AMO's Health Task Force policy paper, *Strengthening Age-Friendly Communities and Seniors' Services for 21st Century Ontario: A New Conversation about the Municipal Role*.

Of significant interest to municipal government, the Province has committed to:

- expanding 30,000 new long-term care beds over the next decade with 5,000 created over the next four years;
- providing 15 million more hours of care in long-term care homes for nursing, personal support, and therapeutic care;
- facilitating greater access to culturally appropriate practices in long-term care homes and in-home supports;
- providing specialized training in behavioural supports and in palliative and end-of-life care;
- expanding the Age-Friendly Community Planning Grant for municipal governments;
- improving community transportation for seniors to connect them with services and support, particularly in Northern Ontario; and

- reconfirming the commitment to expand 40 more Seniors Active Living Centres across the province (formerly known as Elderly Persons Centres). Municipal governments and community agencies can apply for funding through Grants Ontario.

Other measures in the plan are intended to:

- support seniors at all stages of their life;
- support seniors to live independently in their communities;
- support seniors requiring enhanced supports at home and in their communities;
- support seniors living independently in the community; and,
- support seniors who require intensive supports.
