Background	Windsor Arena was constructed in 1924 and is one of the oldest arenas of its' type in North America. It hosted the Windsor Bulldogs, Windsor Spitfires, and the Windsor Lancer Men's Hockey Team. Windsor Arena has also hosted many ice users from minor hockey, figure skating, and adult pick up groups to special events like the Shrine Circus and Dreams on Ice over the years.
	In February 2012 Council asked (CQ8-2012) that Administration explore the possibility of an event to mark the closing of Windsor Arena. In March of 2012 the Windsor Rotary Club held a "Last Skate at the Barn". Other groups such as the Windsor Lancers, St. Clair College Alumni and Windsor Minor Hockey also held "last" closing games at Windsor Arena in 2012.
	The passing of the 2013 budget formally approved the closing of Windsor Arena. Report #16445 requested authorization to form a planning committee to investigate an event to mark the arena's closing (CR62/2013). The committee held two meetings and discussed a number of initiatives that could be undertaken to celebrate the history and share memories of Windsor Arena. Feedback indicated the

	public was more interested in the memories of Windsor Arena and not necessarily the "bricks and mortar" of the building. There is also a feeling that, while some members of the community are still passionate about "the Barn", with the passing of time the Arena's closure has been noted and the community has moved on. The Committee still felt it important to mark the occasion of the Arena's closing but to do so in a cost effective manner that would endure. A video tribute to the "Barn" was proposed to capture the stories and memories of the community, athletes, owners and visitors who made it great. As the expertise for video development is in house, such a tribute could be created without additional investment. Once complete, the video could be shared with the community through schools, libraries, Windsor's Community Museum, the Sports Hall of Fame, social media and websites and shown at a Windsor Spitfires game. Administration is open to other requests for use of the video that highlight and share such an icon of the City of Windsor.
Goal	Windsor Arena played a pivotal role in the fabric of the City of Windsor and many people have fond memories of "The Barn". A video tribute will capture those memories and preserve them for future enjoyment.

Key Messages	The Windsor Arena has been a significant asset to the community, and a symbol for historical events such as the former home of the Detroit Red Wings. Should there be no closing event, there would be a lost opportunity to celebrate the impact that the facility has had on the community.
