#### 4. Presentation

Rakesh Naidu, President and CEO, Windsor-Essex Regional Chamber of Commerce is present to provide information relating to a Twin City economic initiative. The highlights of the presentation are as follows:

- The initiative began after speaking to Ambassadors of 3 countries Argentina, Peru and Equador.
- The premise of this initiative is to support our companies as they go global and compete with foreign markets along with assistance from the Economic Development Corporation and the Chamber of Commerce
- There is currently an agreement with Argentina (Equador and Peru in the pipeline). We will offer them all of the services that any Chamber of Commerce receives at no cost which includes connecting them to businesses here, economic development, government programs and incubators to allow them to easily tap into the Canadian market.
- The proposal is to go to a selective few countries and ask them to sign a formal memorandum of understanding that will serve to extend a reciprocal relationship with the Chambers at no cost.





#### A Letter from Changchun

Dear Sandra Gebauer,

Foreign Affairs Office of Changchun Municipal People's Government extends its highest compliments.

Now, both the government and all the groups are doing their best to battle with the Pneumonia Caused by Novel Coronaviruses in China. By 22:30 on 1<sup>st</sup> February 2020, there were 17 confirmed patients in Jilin Province. Besides, 10 potential patients with suspected cases are being kept in isolation of medical observation. There are 1335 foreigners from all nations working and living in Changchun, including 104 foreign teachers, 1135 foreign students, and 96 foreign staff. Masks, goggles, disinfectants, protective clothing, gloves, and other protective equipment are in large demand.

Changchun as the sister city of Windsor would like to require Windsor's assistance and support. At present, we are in urgent need of medical masks, medical goggles, medical protective clothing and gloves, and disinfectant. (Demand: 3M 9132, FFP3, FFP2, N95, KN95 Disposable Medical Mask;3M 4565, GB19082-2009,

ENIOS13688:2013 Medical Protective Clothing!)

#### Notes from meeting

## on strengthening the cooperation as partners between Windsor and Lublin Town Hall, 19 December 2019

#### Account of meeting

Mr. Jerry (Jerzy) Barycki recalled the collaboration up to now between Windsor and Lublin and talked about changes taking place in Canada. The main subject of the meeting was strengthening of the enduring partnership between the cities Lublin-Windsor as well as setting the conditions for cooperation on commercial and economic development of the cities and the [neighbouring] regions. Jerry Barycki drew attention to the growing significance of persons of Polish heritage in Canadian political life. He gave the example of Member of Parliament Irek Kuśmierczyk, elected to represent Windsor-Tecumseh in the Canadian House of Commons in the federal elections of 2019. Before the elections he was a councellor of the city of Windsor.

Krzysztof Żuk, Mayor of the City of Lublin, Lech Sprawka, Lubelskie Voivode, and Zbigniew Wojciechowski, Vice Marshal of the Lubelskie Voivodeship, emphasized the significance of the good relations of our cities as well as a desire to strengthen the cooperation as partners.

During the meeting, there was a discussion of the possibility of organizing visits in a "3 + 10" format (3 representatives of government from the voivodeship and the city as well as 10 people from the business sector). The timing of the visits was set provisionally: in the summer of 2020 a visit to Lublin, in the autumn of 2020 to Windsor. It was agreed that on the Polish side, the Office of the Marshal is the coordinator of the undertaking. In the course of preparation for the visits, both the Canadian and the Polish sides assumed responsibility for confirming the expectations of business people in the time frame of the economic cooperation.


