

Councillor Halberstadt requests that a bicycle collision statistical analysis including the location and charges be provided by Windsor Police Services. Constable Jurilj states he will contact his Sergeant to determine if this information is available.

Councillor Halberstadt along with C. Copot-Nepszy are collaborating on a bicycle safety pilot project at St. Angela's School.

6.3 **2011 WBC Budget**

Discussion ensues regarding a donation to the Children's Safety Village for the development of an adult cycling safety program or, for bussing grade school children to the Safety Village.

C. Griffiths suggests that the adult cycling safety program be held in the downtown core rather than at the Children's Safety Village.

That an expenditure in the upset amount of \$2,000 **BE DONATED** to the Children's Safety Village for the purpose of developing an Adult Cycling Safety Program or to provide buses to allow grade school children to visit the Children's Safety Village, and further, that Michael Lucier, Executive Director, Children's Safety Village **BE REQUESTED** to provide a business plan to the Windsor Bicycling Committee before the funds are released.

Carried.

The Chair advises he will contact Michael Lucier, Executive Director, Children's Safety Village to discuss the foregoing motion.

C. Copot-Nepszy states that the Windsor-Essex County Health Unit will not be overseeing the "Rediscover Your Bike" Program and asks if the WBC or the City of Windsor are interested in hosting the event.
