

Hi Jo-Anne,

As the frequency and size of the trains on the CP corridor within the City limits increases, so too does the related noise.

Under the Railway Act, there is little that can be done about this as the Rail was in place long before the residences.

There is, however, one process that was introduced with the Border Infrastructure that is the root cause of most of the noise. A VACIS system was installed to scan the rail cars prior to their going into the US just east of Walker Road. This process causes the trains to slow down and often times to sit and idle or even reverse to re-scan a car. This process is extremely noisy and is similar to a train shunting its cars.

My point is that the VACIS was added after the residences were in place and has caused excess noise. A sound attenuation barrier should have been part of the infrastructure installed when this system went in as part of the Border Infrastructure funding. I know that an Environmental Assessment was done as part of the Border Infrastructure projects but don't believe that the issue for noise within the rail corridor was considered.

I would like the committee to look into this issue as it is becoming a serious problem with adjoining residences.
