I. THAT Section 6.1 of By-law 6716 **BE AMENDED** by adding an exemption for the ringing of school bells.

2. BACKGROUND:

A complaint was filed with the Building Department By-law Enforcement Unit on November 21, 2012 under the Emission of Sound By-law for ringing of school bells at J.A McWilliam School 1901 EC Row East. After further investigation it was determined that the PA system had recently been changed to include not only a bell system but also a buzz signal. Through discussions with the School Board Administration and Vice Principal of the School, the intercom buzz tone was changed to now only ring in the portables and not outside or in the main building. There have been no further complaints at this location or elsewhere in the City.

3. **DISCUSSION**:

By-law 6716, A By-law Respecting the Emission of Sounds, provides a table listed under section 3-1 which outlines prohibited types of noise and prohibited periods of time for noise in Commercial and Residential areas. The complainant believed that the ringing of the school bells were a violation under section 3 Table 3-1 3 as follows:

3. The operation of any auditory signalling device, including but not limited to the ringing of bells or gongs and the blowing of horns or sirens or whistles, or the production, reproduction or amplification of any similar sounds by electronic means, except where required or authorized by law or in accordance with good safety practices.		At all times

There is no exemption in the Noise By-law for school property. The Noise By-law only exempts church bells, otherwise auditory ringing is prohibited. This is the first time the By-law Enforcement Unit has received a complaint about school bells.

The ringing of school bells is used as a means of alerting students to return to class and could pose a health and safety risk if the bells were no longer allowed to be used. Therefore it is being recommended that the ringing of school bells be exempted in By-law 6716, A By-law Respecting the Emission of Sounds.
