
# Sculpture Park Maintenance Project Summer 2014

For the next two summers, six conservation students and one Collections Assistant will clean all of the sculptures and document their work. All data collected will be loaded into the Mimsy Database stored/managed at Windsor's Community Museum.

#### Other Project Elements

In addition, a number of sculptures will receive a more comprehensive conservation program to ensure the piece is enjoyed long into the future.

### PUBLIC ART POLICY & PROJECTS



#### Public Art Policy

The City of Windsor defines Public Art as "an original artwork installed permanently or temporarily in such a way as to permit viewing by the public indoors or outdoors. It is intended to be integrated as part of its environment and/or interactive with its surroundings...". Examples include sculptures, statues, murals, functional art, forms of landscaping, etc. Staff are working to update the 2005 policy.

#### **Current Projects**

- Man in the City temporary installation on 5 municipal downtown buildings.
- Our Space temporary installation opportunities within Windsor's Sculpture Park.
