





Outcome #2: Fewer people experience homelessness for the first time (new inflows into homelessness are reduced)



Outcome #3: Fewer people return to homelessness from housing (returns to homelessness are reduced)



The figures represented in 2020-2021 correlate to data fidelity improvements and information collected during the 2021 Coordinated Point in Time Count conducted in March 2021. Achieving zero will require availability of human and financial resources by all levels of government, private sector, community partners/stakeholders. Engagement with community legal clinics may be needed to ensure illegal evictions do not occur.

Outcome #4: Fewer Indigenous peoples experience homelessness (Indigenous homelessness is reduced)



It is anticipated that this figure will increase in 2021-2022 as more Indigenous Peoples begin to re-engage with services.
