
## Bitternut Hickory Carya cordiformis

Hardiness Zone Mature Height Mature Form Features	4 50-60 feet Round to oblong The bark is first smooth and gray. Later broken into long plates attached at the middle, curving away from the trunk resulting in a coarsely shaggy appearance
Insect or Diseases Culture	No common problems Prefers deep, moist soils that range from poorly drained to well drained, but is often found in drier conditions. Tolerates shade in its youth, but needs full sun at maturity, and is adaptable to acidic,
Notes	neutral, or alkaline pH soils. Constantly raining debris from its fruit crop from late summer throughout autumn, making fall cleanup in urban areas more challenging.
