appearance

Insect or Diseases No common problems

Culture Prefers deep, moist, rich,

well-drained soils under sunny conditions, but is often found in the dry upland soils of woods or fields because of its superior drought tolerance.

It tolerates the shade of nearby trees when young, develops its deep taproot


