

BY-LAW NUMBER 81-2019

A BY-LAW TO PROVIDE THAT THE RETAIL BUSINESS HOLIDAYS ACT DOES NOT APPLY IN THE CITY OF WINDSOR

Passed the 17th day of June, 2019.

WHEREAS Section 2(1) of the *Retail Business Holidays Act*, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter R.30, as amended, (the "Act") provides that no person carrying on a retail business in a retail business establishment shall sell or offer for sale any goods or services therein by retail or admit members of the public thereto, on a holiday;

AND WHEREAS Section 1.2(1) of the Act provides that the Act does not apply to a municipality and does not apply in respect of any by-law of the municipality or any retail business establishment located in the municipality if there is in effect a by-law passed by the municipality providing that this Act does not apply to it;

AND WHEREAS a by-law under Section 1.2(1) of the Act does not take effect until the municipality passes a by-law under Section 148 of the *Municipal Act, 2001*, S.O. 2001, Chapter 25, as amended, requiring that one or more classes of retail business establishments be closed on a holiday;

AND WHEREAS By-law Number 80-2019 passed on the 17th day of June, 2019, under Section 148 of the *Municipal Act, 2001*, S.O. 2001, Chapter 25, as amended, requires that all retail business establishments in the City of Windsor be closed on Christmas Day, December 25th;

THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the City of Windsor enacts as follows:

1. In this by-law,
 - (a) "**retail business**" means the selling or offering for sale of goods or services by retail; and
 - (b) "**retail business establishment**" means the premises where a retail business is carried on.
2. Pursuant to Section 1.2(1) of the Act, this Act does not apply to retail business establishments in the City of Windsor.
3. This by-law will not be in force and take effect until after By-law 80-2019 is in force and effect.
