

THAT the Social Development, Health and Culture Standing Committee **ACCEPT** the offer of a monument memorial stone to be placed within Mayfair Park at the former Mayfair School site.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

2. BACKGROUND:

Mayfair School first opened in January of 1928 and operated until 1971 and was located at 2559 Chandler Avenue. Mayfair School Alumni hold reunions every two years to keep the spirit of their school alive. During their reunions, they raised funds for a memorial stone to be placed within the park. The stone will be inscribed to say "Mayfair School, 1928 – 1971 In memory of alumni past & present."

3. DISCUSSION:

Mr. Brian Frickey attended the January 24th Community Public Art Committee meeting to present the alumni's proposal. The monument will be a large piece of stone approximately 4 to 5 feet tall and 3 feet thick with a plaque mounted on the stone.

Discussion with City staff indicated this would be a satisfactory monument for this particular park location.

5. FINANCIAL MATTERS:






