

4. ADOPTION OF THE MINUTES

4. BUSINESS ITEMS

4.1 Monument Donation In Support of the 2013 International Children's Games

C. Masterson states that an artist has offered to donate a monument commemorating the 2013 International Children's Games with a suggestion to erect the monument in Freedom Park. She notes that no specifics are provided such as the artist's name, size, materials to be used or a description of the piece. It is suggested the monument be placed in front the new Family Aquatics Complex.

Moved by J. Langlois, seconded by T. Lawrence Tayler,

That the offer by an artist to donate a monument to commemorate the 2013 International Children's Games **BE DEFERRED** pending further information regarding the artist and the piece.

4.2 Alumni of Mayfair Public School Supporting Placement of a Monumental Stone For Display within the Park at the Former School Site

C. Masterson advises that a letter was received from Mr. Brian Frickey requesting permission to erect an engraved monumental stone on the parkland (former site of the School). The monument will read: "Mayfair School, 1928 – 1971 In memory of alumni past & present".

C. Masterson indicates that the Parks Department is requesting that the monumental stone be placed in a garden bed in the park.

Moved by J. Langlois, seconded by T. Lawrence Tayler,

That Mr. Brian Frickey **BE INVITED** to attend the January 24, 2012 meeting of the Community Public Arts Advisory Committee and to provide background information regarding Mayfair School and the logistics relating to the monumental stone.

4.3 <u>Dieppe Story Boards</u>

M. Della Valle states that a request was received from Mr.-Hardy to erect one plaque/story board with text and images to cover the new Dieppe monument (relevant history of the Essex and Kent Regiment). She notes there is a twin monument in Dieppe, France.

- C. Masterson suggests a meeting be convened with herself, Mr. Hardy and the Manager, Parks Department to discuss the location of the story boards and the associated costs.
- M. Della Valle proposes that the Manager, Parks Department be invited to sit on the Community Public Art Advisory Committee as a resource.

That Administration **BE REQUESTED** to meet with Mr. Hardy to discuss the logistics of the Dieppe Story Board and further, that Mr. Hardy **BE INVITED** to attend the January 24, 2012 meeting of the Community Public Art Advisory Committee.

4.4 Emancipation Celebration Monument to be placed in Jackson Square Park

C. Masterson states that a request was received from Mr. Kim Elliott to erect a monument in Jackson Park commemorating the Emancipation Celebration.

It is generally agreed that an application form be created that will simplify the process for those requesting placement of a monument or, for public art. The following suggestions are provided for inclusion on the application form:

- Choice of location first and second choice
- Describe the art piece/monument
- Wording for the plaque/monument
- Name of the artist
- Cost of maintaining the art/monument
- · Is a charitable receipt required?
- Significant anniversary or celebration date
- Why is the art/monument significant to Windsor
- Maps and photos

Moved by J. Langlois, seconded by T. Lawrence Tayler,

That Mr. Kim Elliott **BE INVITED** to attend the January 24, 2012 meeting of the Community Public Art Advisory Committee and to provide further information relating to the Emancipation Celebration Monument to be erected in Jackson Park.

4.5 Afghanistan War Memorial

C. Masterson reports that a request was received from Mr. Waleed Qazi regarding the erection of an Afghanistan War Memorial. She indicates that the application form will be sent to Mr. Qazi to obtain additional information.

4.6 Monument Commemorating Victims of Genocide in Bosnia

C. Masterson states that a request was received from Senad Alicehajic, President of Bosnian Club Windsor regarding the erection of a monument commemorating the victims of genocide in Bosnia. She notes that the application form will be sent to Senad Alicehajic.

4.8 Request to Create a Sculptural Piece for Ford City

- C. Masterson indicates that a request was received from Ms. Erin E. Fortier, McGill University regarding the installation of a metal sculpture (performance piece) on city park property in the vicinity of Drouillard and Deming. A copy of the metal sculpture including the structural specifications is distributed and <u>attached</u> as Appendix "A". The performance piece will be installed and taken down in a day's time. Ms. Fortier has acquired the \$2,000,000 liability insurance required for such a venture.
- C. Masterson to contact Ms. Fortier to determine if there is still interest in this project.

4.9 Request to Rename the Park (Talbot Trail) in honour of Ed DuMouchelle, Reeve of Sandwich South





CONCEPT

To construct a monument to the resilience, expertise, and resourcefulness of the people of Windsor by reclaiming unused material, space, and skill born of the automotive industry.

This structure will be made of scrap metal parts collected locally by the artist and constructed with a former factory worker from the area, in Ford City Park in front of the former assembly plant.

The day of the installation, the completed structure will serve as a temporary lemonade stand, to reinforce the history of the This metaphor is reverberated in the shape and in the evening lighting of the structure.
