EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

2. BACKGROUND:

Council approved the ACHF grant as part of the 2015 budget process.

The Guidelines for the Arts, Culture and Heritage Fund outlined the process for selecting the jurors as follows "All applications will be assessed by a jury, working with the Cultural Affairs staff. The jury will be comprised of a diverse selection of five (5) people that are arts, culture or heritage professionals. Some have direct experience working with arts, culture and heritage organizations or as individual creators. Others have municipal backgrounds with arts, culture and heritage experience. The ACHF will select jurors who:

- Have a broad spectrum of knowledge and experience of the creative community;
- Have knowledge of the arts, culture and heritage needs of the City of Windsor;
- Will provide fair and objective opinions;
- Can articulate their opinions and work in a group decision-making environment." These jurors diligently completed the evaluation process on all 34 applications received.

3. <u>DISCUSSION</u>:

The Application forms for the Arts Culture and Heritage Fund were posted on the Cultural Affairs webpage with the grant opening on March 30, 2015 and closing on April 17, 2015. There were two public information sessions held discussing eligibility and the application process.

At the close of the application process 34 applications were received requesting funding of \$147,980. If the opportunity to fund all 34 requests were available, the total value of all of the projects would exceed \$430,000, demonstrating how grant funding leverages additional spending on culture within the community. There is \$43,600 available to be distributed in the first round of the Arts, Culture and Heritage Fund.

The jury convened on April 29, 2015 to discuss the application process and the key objectives and priorities of the fund. Each juror had received a complete package of all 34 applications along with the adjudication matrix prior to the meeting. The matrix is attached as Appendix A.

There was a long and involved conversation amongst the jurors to determine the final outcome. The end result was that they awarded a total of 17 individuals and/or organizations funding totalling the available \$43,600.

Below is the list of successful applicants along with a description of the project they submitted for funding. Upon completion of their projects, each applicant is required to submit to the Cultural Affairs office a final report outlining the impact, both financially and within the cultural community of Windsor. Additionally, as identified in earlier reports to Council, all of the projects selected are required to identify the City of Windsor as a funder to the project through the display of the City logo on all project materials.

Essex County Chinese Canadian Association \$1000 These funds will be used to produce a live cultural dance and music performance in Windsor.

Jamie Reaume \$2000 Production of a 6-song solo album.

James Oltean \$2000 Musician James O-L will develop an album of new original music.

Matt Lalonde \$2000 The funds will be used to complete the recording of original music performed by a collective of musicians know as The Rustbelt Revelators.

Nicholas de Cosson \$4000 A prototype light portal will be developed which, once perfected will lead to temporary art installations throughout the city.

Alana Bartol \$2000 Spatial Justice Sandwich Town: A Community Art Project.

Murad Erzinclioglu \$3500 The funds will be used to enhance FAMfest.

Greg Thomas Maxwell \$2500 Development of Bloom (a stop-motion animated film).

Erin Armstrong \$2500 An abridged opera, Mozart's Cosi Fan Tutte will be produced with local opera singers.

Arturo Herrera \$5000 The funds will be used to provide artist fees in the second issue of ARTWINDSOR magazine.

Vanessa Shields \$2500 Mouth Piece will be a storytelling series that will showcase Windsor's storytellers in a year long series of performances.

Greg Stasiak \$600 ATM—Art Transfer Machine—Video Poetry Kiosk. Greg will develop a combination of ordinary street furniture and video monitors to present poetry.

Media City \$5000 The funds will be used to enhance the "Regional Artists Program"

Michelle Soulliere \$3000 DIY Screen-printed t-shirts, a unique program will educate local musicians how to design and deliver t-shirts, posters and marketing materials for better impact.

The Bloomfield House \$1500 The funds will be used to purchase additional drums to be used by residents in drum circles and other community events.

Windsor Dance eXperience \$1500 Performance fees will be funded in order to introduce dance to youth in their new neighbourhood once they have re-located.

Literary Arts Windsor \$3000 Paying homage to the Ontario 400 Francophone, Metis, and First Nations will occur during this year's Bookfest.

Overall, the jury was excited with the variety of applications received. They had many conversations about the partnership opportunities and the artist growth potential through the projects submitted. The jury believes the applications showcase interesting and exciting project ideas, across genres, with many partnership opportunities that definitely accomplish the objectives and priorities of the fund.

4. RISK ANALYSIS:

The Municipal Cultural Master Plan originally recommended that an arm's length commission be established that was a decision-making volunteer body independent of Council and that it would consist of city residents who are familiar with cultural disciplines and cultural organizations in the City.

The Task Force that convened to guide this project to fruition expect there to be a transparent application process in order to have the applications adjudicated without prejudice and therefore supported a jury process that consisted of members of the community nominated for the knowledge and experience that they share with the community.

5. FINANCIAL MATTERS:

Council approved the use of a total of \$87,200 which will be distributed through two rounds of funding of \$43,600. Funding is available through the Cultural Affairs operating budget. Individual grants to be awarded through this project are for a maximum of \$5,000 per grant.

7. <u>CONCLUSION</u>:

The City of Windsor has made a significant contribution to the cultural fabric of the community. The grant funding will continue to grow this sector by providing small amounts of funding to make culture happen now. The purpose of this fund— Investing in the soul of our City by providing financial assistance to locally-developed arts, culture and heritage projects that provide exciting, surprising, and meaningful opportunities to strengthen our creative community—will have an immediate impact on the cultural community.
