

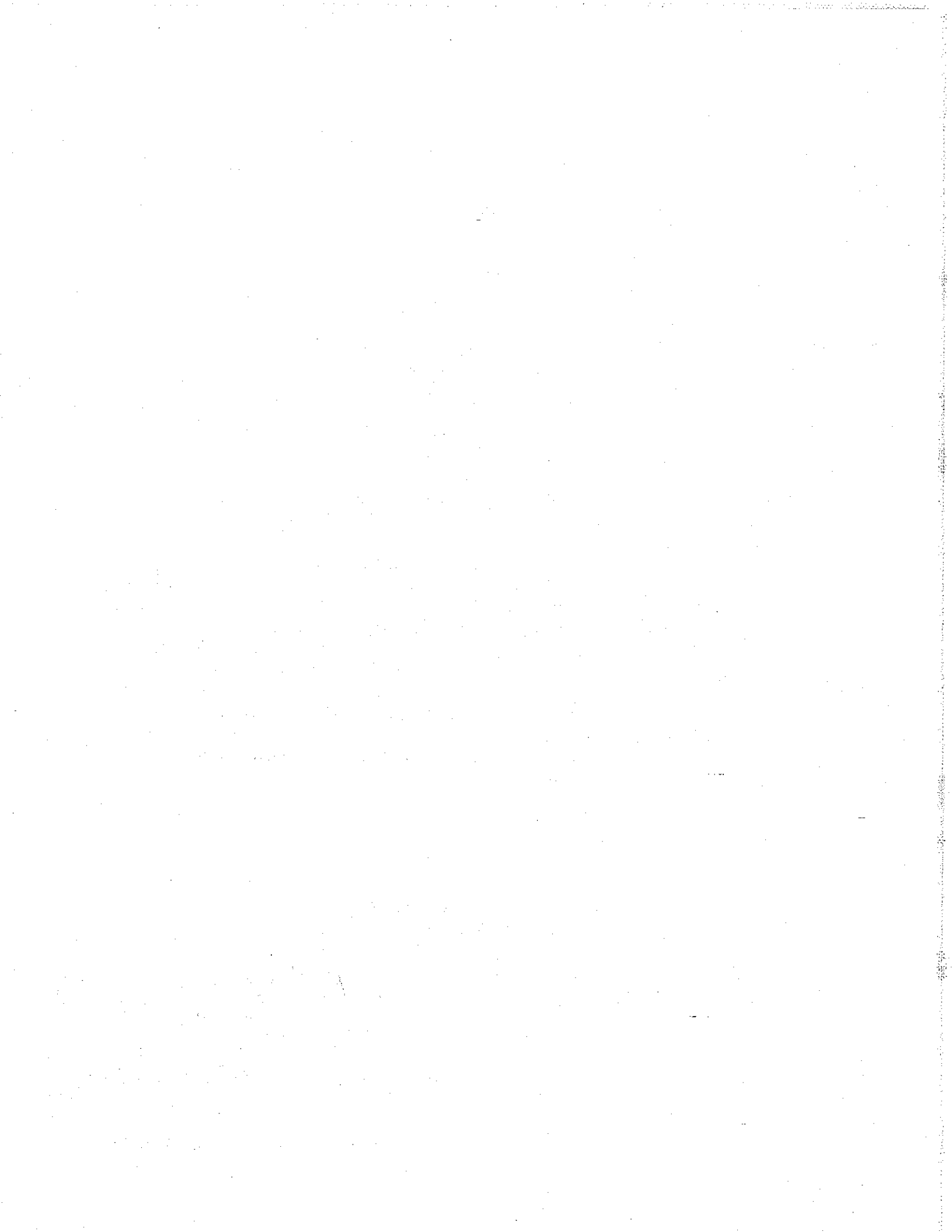

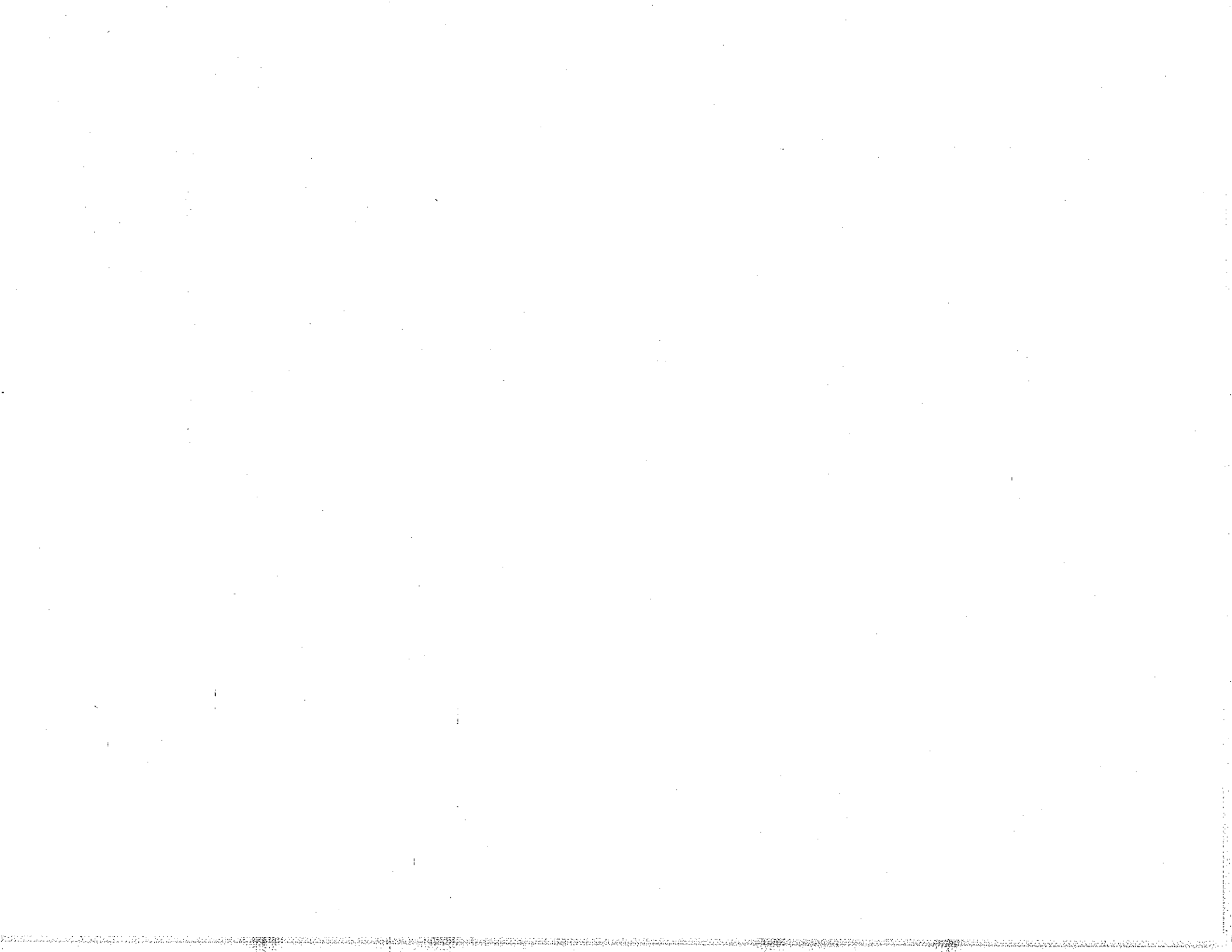

- 1) Description of Barrier Removal Project and how it promotes universal access to all persons with disabilities (include appropriate references to attitudinal, informational, physical, technological, architectural or policy barriers):**

Part 1 - SOUTH WINDSOR RECREATION COMPLEX

The South Windsor Recreation Complex is expanding to incorporate the Oakwood Community Centre. As part of the design process, we contacted WAAC via email and requested input from the committee regarding ways to maximize accessibility in the facility. The meeting took place on May 29th. A number of valuable suggestions were noted by the committee and those are set out below:

Summary of Discussion:

- Archon Architects presented the preliminary schematic floor plan and site plan to the group (copies to be shown and discussed at the June 30th WAAC meeting).
- It was noted that this project is being administered as a Design/Build, meaning final construction drawings will be completed by a separate Consultant team who is paired up with a Contractor.
- The proposed building addition is concentrated on the west side of the existing facility, which will result in a newly configured front entrance (on the west side of the building), complete with automatic sliding doors.
- There is an existing exterior door on the north side of the building, which during construction and in the future, will act as an alternate entrance to the combined facility. ***The committee requested modifications to this existing door to include either push buttons or sliding doors.***
- The building addition includes a new front desk, new program rooms, a gymnasium and new washrooms. ***The committee requested that consideration be given to adding a universal washroom with an adult change table.***
- We discussed the possibility of reconfiguring the parking lot to have the barrier free parking spots closer to the main entrance at the west side of building. After further discussion it was agreed that the existing layout is suitable (from both a functionality and safety stand point).

Therefore we are requesting funding to an upset amount of \$50,000. It is anticipated that \$40,000 would be to cover the cost of the universally accessible washroom which will include an actuator on the door and a motorized adult change table. The Washroom will be designed to the higher standard of either FADS or the accessibility provisions under the building code.

The remaining \$10,000 will be utilized to cover the cost of sliding doors at the existing north entrance of the facility. This will be a retrofit that was not included in the original design. This entrance will be adjacent to the majority of the accessible parking spaces for the facility.

Part 2 – WFCU CENTRE

Seeking two motorized accessible change tables to meet the accessibility needs of our patrons. Please note that we have received a request from a regular user of the WFCU

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Centre who has a child who could greatly benefit from the provision of such an accessibility feature. We believe it would be beneficial to have one change table to be located in the family washroom (near Section 118) of the main bowl and the second to be located in the in the community centre family washroom next to the Sports gym of the WFCU Centret. We would be requesting funding to an upset amount of \$10,000 to cover the cost of the motorized change tables including shipping and installation.

2) Provide a list of users and groups that will benefit from this barrier removal activity:

Both projects are meant to maximize the accessibility of the facilities and meet the needs of our valuable patrons.

The cost of the original design is being covered by the Recreation and Culture department. Requests made under this funding application are in addition to what was in the original design and were suggestions put forward by the representatives of WAAC.
