**“National Day of Mourning”
April 28, 2026**

- WHEREAS:** April 28th has been designated as the National Day of Mourning; and,
- WHEREAS:** The Corporation of the City of Windsor and Transit Windsor recognize the sacrifice of our employees and their families when workplace incidents occur; and,
- WHEREAS:** Flags at municipal buildings, including the Great Canadian Flag at the riverfront, will be lowered to half mast to recognize Canada's National Day of Mourning, a day annually dedicated to remembering those who have lost their lives, suffered severe injury or on the job illness, or experienced a workplace tragedy; and,
- WHEREAS:** We encourage you to take a moment at 11:00 o'clock a.m. on Tuesday, April 28th to reflect on our collective efforts and what you can do individually to ensure that workplace health and safety is our highest priority; and,
- WHEREAS:** Everyone has a role to play in keeping our workplaces accident free. Please keep yourself and those around you safe,
