1. Call to Order

The Chair calls the meeting to order at 9:02 o'clock a.m.

2. Disclosure of Pecuniary Interest

3. Adoption of the Minutes

4. Delegations

Terrance Kennedy, Area Resident

Terrance Kennedy, area resident appears before the Finance Committee – Economic Development and Engineering and requests that the city take the area of pollution control and environmental protection more seriously; to acknowledge the dangers now in place and those yet to come; provides details related to air quality monitoring in 2022; and concludes by indicating that he looks forward to the opening of the new hospital, however, there are no environmental protections.

Nate Hope and Joshua Sankarlal, Members Activate Transit Windsor Essex

Nate Hope and Joshua Sankarlal, Members Activate Transit Windsor Essex appear before the Finance Committee – Economic Development and Engineering and provide a brief background of their committee and provide details regarding their community mandate which was released in 2022, a survey with 620 respondents, provide key points including the frequency and reliability of Transit; the implantation of the Transit Windsor Master Plan; operating hours that benefit riders; and conclude by providing a brief overview of some of the challenges that exist including extended wait times at bus stops and bypasses at the transit stop which cause workers taking the bus to be late for work, people miss essential medical appointments, etc.; and conclude by suggesting that The Transit Master Plan is a positive step in the right direction and the city should provide stable funding to ensure a timely implementation.

Zachery Balough, Member Activate Transit Windsor Essex

Zachery Balough, Member Activate Transit Windsor Essex appears before the Finance Committee – Economic Development and Engineering and indicates that he is an active user of Transit Windsor; and with the influx of newcomers and international students, the City of Windsor is growing at a rapid rate; expresses concern with overcrowding on all the

buses, wait time to take buses, Sunday wait times are increased and concludes by suggesting that the City should make significant improvements to the scheduling of the buses and undertake a review of all the routes.

Ching Yui Leung, Member Activate Transit Windsor Essex

Ching Yui Leung Member Activate Transit Windsor Essex appears before the Finance Committee – Economic Development and Engineering and indicates he is an avid user of Transit Windsor; and concludes by reiterating that the population of the City of Windsor is rapidly expanding and there is a great need for transit as not everyone has a vehicle.

Councillor Fred Francis states that he appreciates the comments provided by Nate Hope and Joshua Sankarlal and adds that Nate has indicated that there must be stable funding to ensure that the Transit Windsor Master Plan is implemented properly and is asking for a long-term commitment. Councillor Fred Francis indicates that the budget for Transit Windsor is approximately \$17 million and provides clarification related to his reference to efficiencies. Mr. Sankarial adds that since the Transit Windsor Master Plan was approved by Council, there has been less than one million dollars invested in the Plan since 2019.

Councillor Fred Francis indicates that COVID is not being factored in as there was a decrease in ridership at that time. He further states that the Transit budget has increased every year over the ten years that he has sat on Council.

Councillor Fred Francis inquires for direction related to moving forward with the Transit Windsor Master Plan. Tyson Cragg, Executive Director Transit Windsor appears before the Finance Committee – Economic Development and Engineering and indicates that they have been successful in implementing elements of the Master Plan and looked at those changes in an incremental fashion. Mr. Cragg adds that in the Master Plan, there are several peaks and valleys – some years require an increased amount of investment to service hours and capital, and other years is a little bit lighter. Mr. Cragg indicates that Transit has been increasing service in the range of 4-6% per year for the last few years and adds that transit's net budget has increased 22% since 2019. In terms of a 5-year plan, they are open to that.

Councillor Fred Francis inquires about the correlation between increased ridership and increased investment. Mr. Cragg indicates there is a correlation and adds that in 2024, ridership on some routes has exceeded expectations.

Councillor Fred Francis inquires if ridership increases 40%, how is that shown in the fixed expenses. Mr. Cragg responds from a capital perspective; they have been able to incorporate all the changes within the existing fleet.

Councillor Gary Kaschak inquires whether there is tracking in the stats that identify the number of buses that bypass people, or the 40-minute interval wait time. Mr. Cragg

responds that on some routes they can track that information to know what their overload levels are and those are used as one of the many data points that are considered.

Councillor Gary Kaschak inquires about the increase in ridership being up 40% and which fare rate that applies to. Mr. Cragg indicates that there is an increase in student fares, senior fares, and regular fares.

Councillor Gary Kaschak comments that the issue today is the increase potentially to the Windsor ratepayer and inquires about discussions with the college and the universities as they are driving a great deal of the ridership and whether the school boards are contributing enough to the Transit Windsor overall picture. Joe Mancina, Chief Administrative Officer appears before the Finance Committee – Economic Development and Engineering and indicates that the City has the Student Pass Programs both at the College and the University of Windsor and they work closely on establishing rates which are appropriate for the students and try to recover whatever costs that are associated with that incremental service. Mr. Mancina adds that they strive to have a recovery of costs associated with the student ridership but there are some limits to the ability to do that especially when you have significant uptake as the city has had. They continue to analyze what role those educational institutions have in assisting financially.

Councillor Jim Morrison indicates that the international student population has become a large component and requests that Mr. Cragg provide comments regarding whether Transit has noticed a change due to the policies at the Federal level. Mr. Cragg responds that they have not seen immediate change in ridership and adds that it will take some time to see those Federal and Provincial changes come into play. Mr. Cragg indicates that in terms of the student ridership, it is across various routes, and the need for housing has pushed students into areas not traditionally resided in, resulting in ridership increases across many routes.

Councillor Jim Morrison inquires whether Transit tracks how on time the buses are for the various routes. Mr. Cragg responds that they are in the high 90% in terms of service deployment. Mr. Cragg adds that there are times when buses do not arrive on time especially at peak service times which has to do with many factors including construction and detours and the overall condition of the infrastructure. If buses are full, it takes longer to load and unload which can increase pressure on the schedule.

Councillor Jim Morrison inquires as to what has been done this year to implement the Transit Windsor Master Plan. Mr. Cragg provides an overview of the various works that have been undertaken and adds that routes are being added on a regular basis.

Mr. Mancina provides an update as it relates to the administrative review that has been undertaken and indicates that the estimates to potential property tax increases have decreased to 7.37% from the original estimate of 12.9%. The finance team will be reporting back with further opportunities for potential decreases to the overall estimate.
