Background

Huron lodge would like to purchase a LED Solar projector to add to our portable Snoezelen Cart. Snozelen is a therapy for residents with developmental disabilities, dementia or brain injury. It consists of placing the person in a soothing and stimulating environment, called the "Snoezelen room". These rooms are specially designed to deliver stimuli to various senses, using lighting effects, color, sounds, music, scents, etc. The solar projector would be a wonderful addition to the portable cart as it one of the best methods for visual stimulation.

Benefits

The addition of the Solar Projector to the current Snoezelen cart would enhance the scope of the therapy we are able to provide to our residents that have sensory, cognitive and physical disabilities.

Cost: The cost of the solar projector is \$1367.05 plus HST.
