<p><b>Introduction:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The purpose of this meeting was discussed; this purpose being to provide an overview of the project to Essex Terminal Railway (ETR), discuss any concerns ETR may have regarding the project, discuss the possibility of incorporating an overpass over the railway, and request information from ETR which may be of use to describe potential railway impacts on wildlife.</li> <li>The meeting attendees introduced themselves to one another and provided a brief description of their role / involvement with the Project.</li> </ul>	
<p><b>Safety Moment:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>A Safety Moment discussing the use of Christmas lights was presented. Safe ladder use, inspection of electrical wires, and use of lights when unattended were all briefly reviewed.</li> </ul>	
<p><b>Brief Description of the Project:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>NH provided a brief description of the project goal / opportunity statement, the assessed alternatives, the selected preferred solution and the common theme of public comments received to date.</li> </ul>	
<p><b>ETR Opportunity to Voice Concerns:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>TDT explained that ETR wants to be part of the process and considers the City a partner in improving the condition of the natural environment in the City.</li> </ul>

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<b>MATTERS DISCUSSED</b>	<b>ACTION BY:</b>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• TDT confirmed ETR's desire for messaging related to the project to be consistent from the City and ETR.</li> <li>• TDT stated that ETR would consider accepting an overpass over the railway but it would need to meet certain design criteria and ensure the railway's continued rights of use and access.</li> <li>• FW requested that the ETR provide information related to the required clearance / envelope for an overpass span over the railway.</li> </ul>	<b>ETR</b>
<p><b>Overpass Crossing of ETR</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• NH explained that the City and Wood are considering an option which would involve the construction of a second span of overpass which would cross the railway.</li> <li>• NH explained that for such a crossing to be viable, the western abutment would need to be placed on lands currently owned by ETR.</li> <li>• NH asked TDT if ETR would be willing to consider a land severance or easement type arrangement to enable the construction of the westernmost abutment and landing on ETR lands.</li> <li>• TDT replied that it is unlikely that ETR would consider such an arrangement; however, they would be willing to entertain a sale or land-swap which would include the entire linear corridor adjacent to the railway. The reasoning behind this being that severance of a single square/rectangular area from the corridor would mean that the remaining linear portion could no longer be utilized functionally by the railway (it would segment/split the area in which they would need to run any additional expansion or features linearly adjacent to their existing railway lines).</li> <li>• PM stated that he would follow-up with the appropriate City department to determine what might be required for such a purchase or land swap to occur.</li> </ul>	<b>City</b>
<p><b>Fencing</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• NH explained that fencing will be required to funnel wildlife to the overpass and to prevent wildlife from entering / re-entering Ojibway Parkway. NH further explained a preference to install such fencing immediately adjacent to the existing multi-use trail instead of along the existing ETR / City property line. A Google Earth image was presented briefly to illustrate the approximate location of such fencing.</li> <li>• TDT stated that ETR did not see an issue with such a plan, but would need to review design drawings to confirm this.</li> <li>• TDT noted that if the City acquires the land to the west of the active railway from ETR, then ETR would expect fencing to be installed along this new west edge to funnel wildlife to the overpass.</li> </ul>

<p><b>Additional Discussion Related to ETR</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• When asked TDT confirmed that ETR does not currently have any expansion plans for the railway in this area.</li><li>• When asked TDT confirmed that ETR would be willing to allow the City or their consultant within the railway corridor to monitor wildlife mortality on the tracks, post-construction of the overpass, so long as a signed agreement related to safety and access constraints was in place.</li><li>• When asked TDT informed the team that the frequency and duration of use of the tracks varies day to day and is based generally on business operations and customer demands, there is no seasonal patterns of note which effect the frequency of use.</li><li>• TDT informed the team that ETR has recently completed a railway traffic study for work completed near Broadway, and this could be provided to the Project team.</li><li>• TDT informed the team that ETR has recently been involved with an overpass installation as part of the Herb Gray Parkway Plaza construction and as such has recent information related to ETR's needs and requirements for such an installation.</li><li>• NH stated that Wood will prepare a list of questions and documents to request from ETR to assist in the ongoing Class EA for the Project.</li></ul>	<p><b>ETR</b></p> <p><b>Wood</b></p>

<p><b>Introduction:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The purpose of this meeting was to share the preliminary preferred design with Essex Terminal Railway and discuss how public’s comments received as a result of Public Information Centre (PIC) #1 were incorporated into the preliminary preferred design. Information at this meeting was presented using the slides developed for the PIC #2, that was we held from April 19, 2021 to May 3, 2021.</li> </ul>	-
<p><b>Preliminary Preferred Design:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Wood provided an overview of the comments received as part of the PIC# 1. The majority of key comments received as part of PIC #1 expressed concern that the Wildlife Overpass did not extend over the railway tracks and the wildlife fencing was not incorporated into the project design.</li> <li>Wood explained that, following the PIC #1, four alternative design concepts were identified for the Wildlife Overpass. These options included:               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Alternative 1 - Wildlife Overpass (3 Span Bridge)</li> <li>Alternative 2 - Wildlife Overpass (4 Span Bridge)</li> <li>Alternative 3 - Wildlife Overpass (2 Span Bridge)</li> <li>Alternative 4 - Wildlife Overpass (4 Span Arch Culvert)</li> </ul> </li> <li>All options considered future extension of the overpass over railway tracks and wildlife fencing. Alternative 2 – Wildlife Overpass (4 Span Bridge) was identified as the Preliminary Preferred Design. The Study will proceed on</li> </ul>	-

<p>the assumption that the western slope of the Wildlife Overpass will end at the Ojibway Trail, east of railway yard. Monitoring will be conducted by the City of Windsor in the future to monitor performance of the Wildlife Overpass and mortality on railway tracks. If the need to extend the Wildlife Overpass across the railway yard is identified, the City may consider providing the structure over the railway corridor, subject to the availability of funding to support additional studies, design, property acquisition and construction. In addition, wildlife fencing has been incorporated into the design along Ojibway Parkway and Broadway Street to prevent wildlife from entering onto the Ojibway Parkway and to direct wildlife to the proposed wildlife overpass.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Tony did not have any comments or concerns regarding the identified Preliminary Preferred Design.</li><li>• Paul noted that one of the comments received is to consider providing a gap between railway trains at the railyard. Would the ETR consider this?</li><li>• Tony responded that the ETR is willing to work with the City on this project. However, it is not feasible to leave a gap between the railway trains because the schedule for the railway trains is different throughout the day. Tony added that ETR will discuss this matter internally and confirm if this approach can be considered.</li></ul>

As you may be aware, the City of Windsor is undertaking a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) study to consider the construction of a Wildlife Crossing at Ojibway Parkway, south of Broadway Boulevard, in the City of Windsor to begin re-establishing an ecological connection between Black Oak Heritage Park and Ojibway Park. The project team has prepared a Draft Environmental Study Report to document the planning, decision making, and consultation process for this Class EA Study. We are legal counsel for The Essex Terminal Railway Company (“ETR”).

The City has requested ETR’s consent to, and cooperation in, the preparation of a monitoring program to document mortality of wildlife crossing the ETR switching yard running parallel with Ojibway Parkway. This would support the above-captioned EAS process.

After due consideration, ETR has decided that it will not permit this monitoring to occur on its lands.

ETR has further concluded that any proposed wildlife bridge terminating at its Eastern boundary with Ojibway Parkway is very likely to encourage wildlife, including potential rare species and species at risk, to enter onto its rail yard. This is inappropriate and not acceptable to ETR.

ETR will oppose any proposal which will tend to put wildlife at increased risk by encouraging further travel across its rail yard and, if such a proposal is implemented, ETR will take proactive steps on its own lands to erect barriers at its boundaries to prevent, to the extent possible, such further wildlife migration from occurring.

We acknowledge ETR's expressed concern of wildlife and potential species at risk (SAR) migrating into the railway corridor. Based on this concern, it would appear that extending the

wildlife overpass structure to also span the railway corridor would be the preferred approach to address your concerns and would be supported by the Essex Terminal Railway (ETR). To update the Environmental Assessment (EA) and associated preliminary design to include a preferred span over the railway corridor, additional biological surveys are required on ETR land holdings to the west of the tracks. These additional studies will support identification of baseline conditions only for use in the environmental impact assessment. This would not include monitoring of wildlife mortality on the tracks or any investigative work inside the active rail corridor.

Would the ETR be supportive of providing permission to enter their lands for the purpose of conducting the aforementioned biological studies?

We would like to arrange a meeting with ETR (and their solicitors if required) to confirm the details and design criteria which ETR requires to be applied for the City's design of a wildlife overpass structure crossing the railway.

Please see the following request for our ETR Monitoring Program as discussed in our meeting on Thursday April 7, 2022.

The City of Windsor is undertaking a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Study for a wildlife crossing of Ojibway Parkway south of Broadway Boulevard to identify opportunities to provide safe passage for area wildlife. Currently the Study has held two Public Information Centres, met with stakeholders, and prepared a draft Environmental Study Report which was provided to stakeholders for review and

comment prior to being issued for public review. A link to the draft ESR on the City website is provided:

One theme of questions and comments received through public and stakeholder engagement is related to the potential for increases for wildlife mortality crossing the Essex Terminal Railway's existing switching yard if the preferred alternative ends within the existing vegetated area between Ojibway Parkway and the ETR tracks, essentially leaving wildlife on their own to navigate the crossing of the tracks.

The City has identified the effect of the switching yard on wildlife is not fully understood, and cannot be easily inferred due to a lack of published studies and information on cases focusing on switching yard impacts on wildlife (specifically as it relates to wildlife movement). As a result the City is proposing that a monitoring program could be conducted within the ETR lands with the following objectives:

1. Document mortality of wildlife associated with the switchyard operation.
2. Identify wildlife currently crossing, or attempting to cross the tracks, with a specific focus on reptiles and amphibians.
3. Document wildlife behavior upon approach to crossing the tracks.

The monitoring would commence as soon as possible since survey windows for some species of amphibians have already started. To conduct this monitoring program the City would require permission from ETR to access their lands, and work in proximity to the train tracks. This monitoring would likely be performed during night-time surveys for reptiles and amphibians and potentially daytime surveys to follow-up on track mortality. Surveys are proposed to be performed approximately three times per week near dusk for April – June and twice weekly for June - October. Notification will be provided to designated ETR staff prior to time of arrival and upon departure. Additional documentation of wildlife behaviour would be performed through the use of camera surveillance directed parallel to the tracks to monitor wildlife approaching the tracks from Black Oak Heritage Park.

The City would use qualified personnel with appropriate PPE and safety training, including any safety training or orientation specific to ETR. There is also a possibility to employ certain individuals for the monitoring which have Personal Track Safety (PTS) training and experience working in conjunction with Metrolinx in rail corridors owned by CN and CPR. All of the proposed work on ETR lands will be done by foot (no vehicles in the rail corridor).

The City would share the results with ETR, and will not disclose results to the public without ETR's consent.

It would be appreciated if ETR could review this plan and let us know if you have any concerns or wish to discuss any specific aspects of the plan.

If ETR supports this plan then can you please let us know and we will begin to make arrangements to perform the monitoring activities.

<b>1.0 PURPOSE OF THE MEETING</b>	
1.1 Study Team initiated the meeting by thanking the attendees from ETR. Study Team provided a brief overview of the project background and current status, noting that an option to extend the Wildlife Crossing across ETR lands was identified, however, ETR expressed some concerns related to this option. The intent of this meeting was to discuss those concerns and potential strategy to address those concerns.	
1.2 Gerry (as ETR's legal counsel) recommended that City of Windsor's legal counsel be present in this meeting and provided the option of excluding himself from the meeting. He also recommended if City's legal counsel is not participating in the meeting, then all the comments/input should be vetted through City's legal counsel before sharing with ETR. Study Team noted that the meeting was an informal discussion to understand ETR's concerns, and can involve City's legal counsel in any future discussions.	
<b>2.0 ETR'S CONCERNS</b>	
2.1 Gerry started by noting that ETR functions under the Sections 100 and 101 of the Canada Transportation Act. This Act governs the obligations of the railway crossings of the federally regulated railway lines, and it encourages parties to enter into written agreements for road or utility crossings (pipelines, telecommunications, etc.).

<p>2.2 Gerry noted that it is ETR's preference that the crossing be developed somewhere else. He highlighted the following key concerns:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>— Crossing of the railway switching yard is not preferred. It would require the City to agree to design the crossing in a way to not to limit ETR's use of the property for switching purposes.</li><li>— Construction, operation and maintenance of the crossing should not affect ETR.</li><li>— ETR does not want to have any surveys/studies completed on its property.</li><li>— ETR's concerns are not only economical and operational, but also to ensure that wildlife does not migrate on to ETR lands. Barrier fencing would be required to funnel the wildlife onto the crossing. Without the fencing, the wildlife may funnel on to ETR tracks.</li><li>— Giving a small section would interrupt the "linearity" of the whole line.</li></ul> <p>2.3 Nathan added that the purpose of the project is re-establish a connection between Ojibway Park and Black Oak Heritage Park. The separation between the two parks is the Ojibway Parkway and ETR tracks.</p> <p>2.4 Karen added that the Study Team also reviewed other locations within the Study Area. We had to avoid installing the crossing at the southern extent of the parks because of the presence of the species at risk plants in that area. Karen added that exclusion/directional fencing will be part of the Wildlife Crossing.</p>	
<p><b>3.0 POTENTIAL STRATEGY FOR MOVING FORWARD</b></p>	
<p>3.1 Gerry noted that for a crossing across ETR switchyard, the following concerns would need to be considered:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>— ETR would want to preserve the operational use of its lands by providing appropriate vertical clearance for the crossing. As such, the Wildlife Crossing across the ETR switchyard would need to provide appropriate clearance to not to interfere with ETR operations.</li><li>— The Wildlife Crossing would need to provide fencing to keep the wildlife from entering the ETR lands.</li><li>— ETR would not be responsible for any costs associated with construction, operation, maintenance and deconstruction.</li><li>— ETR would not be interested having any studies/surveys completed on its lands.</li></ul> <p>3.2 Gerry stated he would be interested in seeing an example of wildlife crossing. The only one he was able to find was the one is the CP crossing in Alberta.</p> <p>3.3 Sergio thanked Tony and Gerry for attending the meeting.</p>

Good afternoon, Mir:

I am following up on your recent correspondence to The Essex Terminal Railway Company (ETR) regarding the proposed Ojibway Parkway Wildlife Crossing and Environmental Assessment.

We are writing to express our concerns with the location of the proposed crossing and its proximity to our active rail yard.

ETR is concerned that any proposed wildlife bridge terminating at its easterly boundary with Ojibway Parkway is very likely to encourage wildlife, including potential rare species and species at risk to enter onto its rail yard. This is inappropriate and not acceptable to ETR.

Any proposal which will tend to put wildlife at increased risk by encouraging travel near or adjacent to our rail yard without the appropriate barriers or controls is not acceptable to ETR. If such a proposal were implemented, ETR would consider taking proactive steps on its own lands to erect barriers at its boundaries to prevent, to the extent possible, such further migration from occurring.

ETR wishes to avoid any crossing over its rail yard whether by span over its rail yard, by grade separated crossing or otherwise. In particular, ETR is concerned that any proposed wildlife crossing by span over its rail yard could pose an obstruction and reduce its level of service for the movement of goods by rail for its customers.
