Achieving our goals is a collective responsibility that will require cross-sectoral **collaborative action** to develop system-level solutions.


We will implement **evidence-based** solutions with a focus on efficiency, cost effectiveness and continuous improvement.

Achieving the goals under the Plan will require **leveraging additional resources** from all level of government.





ONTARIO RENOVATES SOCIAL HOUSING REPAIR PROGRAM (OR-SHRP)

The 2023-24 Ontario Renovates Social Housing Repair Program (OR-SHRP) is funded under Ontario's Community Housing Renewal Strategy and is intended to assist Windsor and Essex County Social Housing Provider(s) to rehabilitate units that require essential repairs in an effort to preserve and extend the functional lifespan of the social housing supply and/or modify units to increase accessibility.




