- BIKEWAY SIGNAGE** (not shown on map)
- BIKEWAY ROUTE Marker Sign**
Indicates that the roadway is an official bicycle route. Motorists are to watch for cyclists and be prepared to share the road with them.
 - RESERVED BIKE LANE Sign**
Indicates that the lane is reserved for exclusive use of bicycles. This is designated by a lane marking separating the portion of road used by motor vehicles from the portion of road used by bicycles. May or may not have a buffer.
 - SHARROW Road Marking**
Sharrows are road markings that help cyclists position themselves on the road while reminding both motorists and cyclists to share the space.
 - SHARED PATHWAY Sign**
Indicates that the lane is designed to accommodate both pedestrians and cyclists. Maximum speed limit on all trails and pathways is 20km/h.
 - LOCAL STREET BIKEWAY**
Shared Use Lane by vehicles and bikes (sharrows) on traffic-calmed streets.
